About the Park

The Park was established by Trinity College in 1970. Trinity is the largest of the 31 colleges of the University of Cambridge.

Today the 152-acre site is home to about 100 businesses ranging from spin-outs from Cambridge to multinational companies. Many are working on potentially life changing technologies from personalised medicines and non-invasive cancer diagnosis to artificial intelligence, Internet of Things, display technologies and connectivity as well as entertainment - to name just a few.

Over the last 50 years the Park has evolved to meet the changing needs of science-based businesses. The current phase of development - funded by TusPark of Beijing - comprises five new buildings to replace the units that were built in the 1970s. These include the two large buildings recently constructed at the entrance to the Park from the Milton Road.

Shortly before lockdown we secured planning permission for a hotel with a pub, restaurant, coffee shop, gym, pool and conference centre. We remain committed to enhancing the Park's amenities but in the current economic climate, unfortunately our plans for this development have been put on hold.

We have launched our <u>2050 Vision</u> which includes recommendations for the next phases of development including amenities, transport and out-door spaces. We will be reporting on the outcome of the 'It's YOUR Park survey' in the autumn.

We are fortunate to have two stations within a short distance of the Park - Cambridge Station and Cambridge North Station.

Cambridge North Station

Cambridge North Station is located on Cowley Road. The station opened in May 2017. There is a direct train to Cambridge North from 43 stations including the lines served by London King's Cross, London Liverpool Street, Ely, King's Lynn, Peterborough and Norwich. Taxi*

We operate a free taxi service from the station Monday - Friday from 07:00 to 09:30 at 15 minute intervals. Look for the grey 8-seater with the CSP logo. No need to pre-book. Operates on a first come, first served basis. Usual transfer times are approx 15 minutes. Evening service runs from 16:00 to 18:30 with one pick-up point at the Trinity Centre car park.

Grove Primary School
